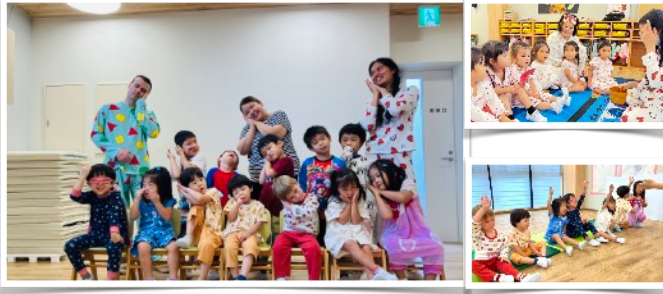

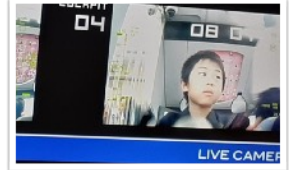
Memories from Our September Events

Kidzania



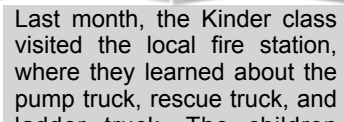

MONTHLY ACTIVITY : GHOST CRAFT

Materials Needed:

- Black construction paper
- Paper plate
- White toilet paper
- Scissors
- Glue
- Double-sided tape



1. Using black construction paper, cut out shapes for the ghost's eyes and mouth.
2. Paste the eyes and mouth onto a paper plate.
3. Tear or cut strips of toilet paper.
4. Stick double-sided tape on the back of the paper plate. Attach the tissue paper strips to the bottom of the plate, creating a flowing ghost effect.
